

Sir Edward 'Weary' Dunlop **Asia Lecture**

The Sir Edward 'Weary' Dunlop Asia Lecture encourages eminent Australians and Asians to present their vision for Australia-Asia relations into the 21st century and to commemorate the life and vision of Sir Edward 'Weary' Dunlop. The lecture consistently attracts high profile speakers and is the occasion for awarding the Dunlop Asia Medal and Dunlop Asia Fellowships.

The Sir Edward 'Weary' Dunlop Asia Lecture was inaugurated in December 1993, by the then Prime Minister of Australia, Paul Keating, to commemorate the life of the late Sir Edward 'Weary' Dunlop, one of Australia's most revered citizens and a pioneer of Australia-Asia relations.


